


Mass for the NHS

National Rosary Rally

People are invited to join the National Rosary Rally taking place in dioceses throughout England, Wales and Scotland from 9am to 9pm on Pentecost Sunday, 31 May.

Pope Francis is encouraging Catholics to pray the Rosary in their family homes during the month of May, especially when the pandemic is making us aware of the value of our families and making it possible for us to pray together at home.

He encourages simple Rosaries and joining online Rosary initiatives to pray to Our Lady for deliverance from Covid-19 and he has composed two prayers for this intention.

In each diocese people are encouraged to pray the Rosary individually, in families, as online prayer groups or parish groups, where possible led online by their parish priests, at any time within the specified hour.

Since the UK-wide COVID-19 lockdown began on 23 March 2020, there has been a 49% increase in calls and online requests for help relating to domestic abuse. The Domestic Abuse Group of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has issued guidance on how Catholic parishes can support victims of domestic abuse during the COVID-19 pandemic. The guidance includes information about how parishes can raise awareness of the issue, including a list of helplines and information about how to safely get help. It also contains a step-by-step starter guide for how parishes can support their local domestic abuse services. The guidance can be found on the CBCEW website at:

Breda has said that "All Boots Chemists shops which have a pharmacy counter and consulting room are now able to help. All domestic abuse sufferers have to do is go to the pharmacy (not the till) counter where trained staff can help. Of course the moment that someone who suffers domestic abuse is most at risk is the moment they try to get help, which is why calls, texts and online searches for help can be very risky if the abuser finds them. So the Boots option may be better in those cases"
